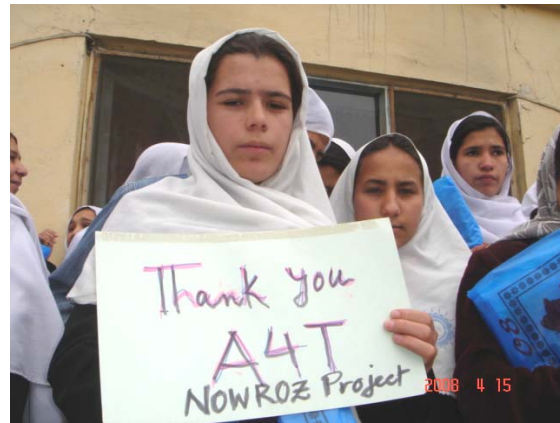


Afghans4Tomorrow - Nowrooz Project, 4-8 to 4-15, 2008
